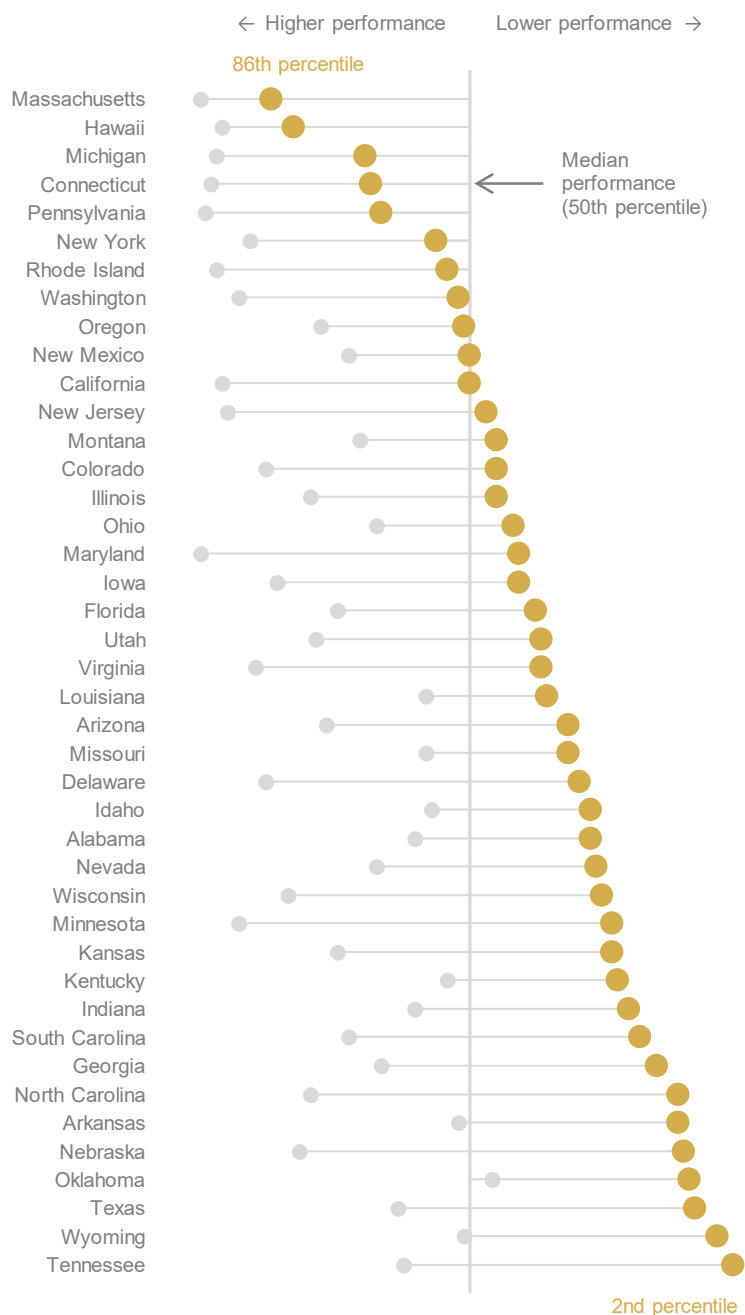


# Health Equity for Latinx/Hispanic People in the United States

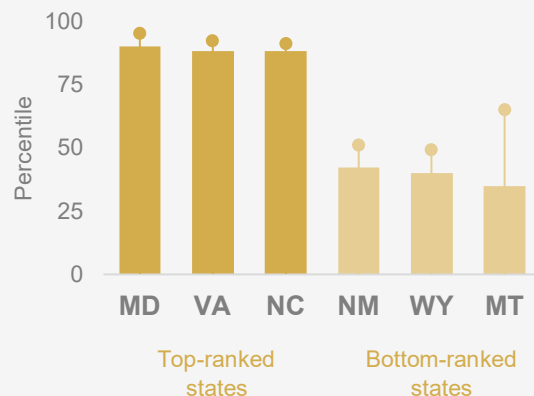
## Overall State Health System Performance for Latinx/Hispanic People



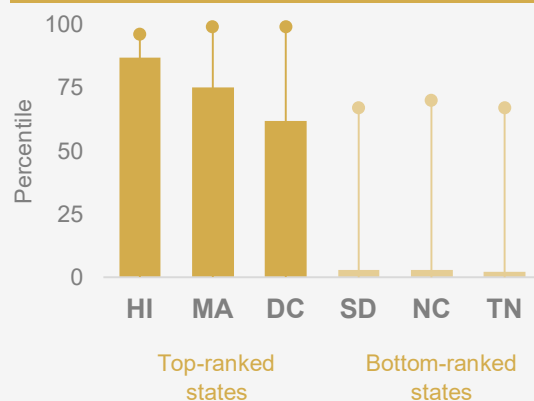

Higher scores reflect better performance, and center line is median performance among all groups. Highlighted point is state's health system performance for Latinx/Hispanic people; grey point is highest score for any group in the state. States only have an overall score when there are sufficient data for all three domains: health outcomes, access, and quality. Scores for Latinx/Hispanic ethnicity not available for: AK, DC, ME, MS, NH, ND, SD, VT, and WV.

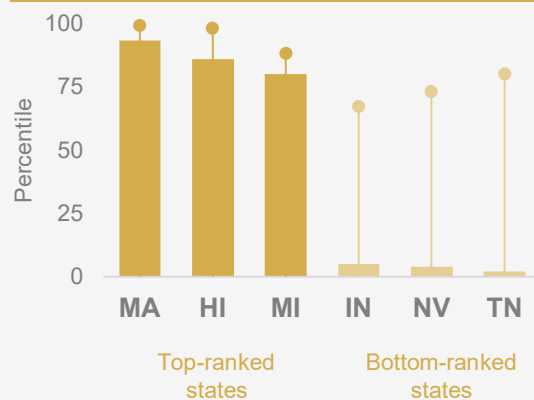
