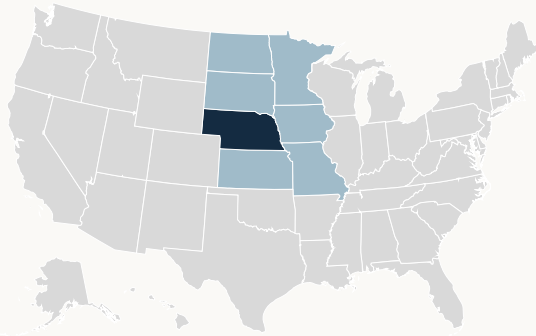

Nebraska ranks #15 overall.

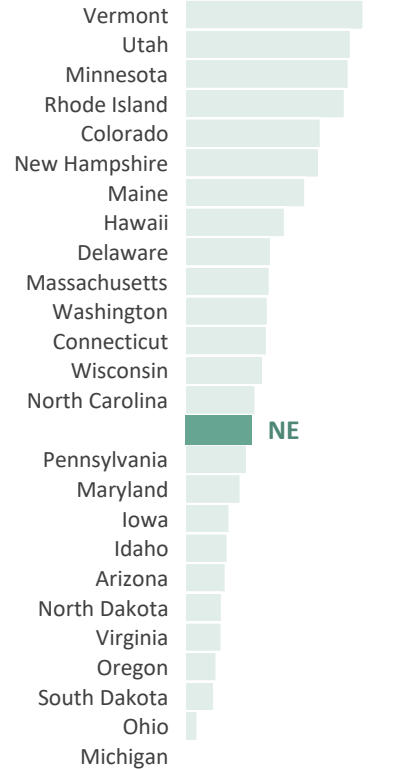

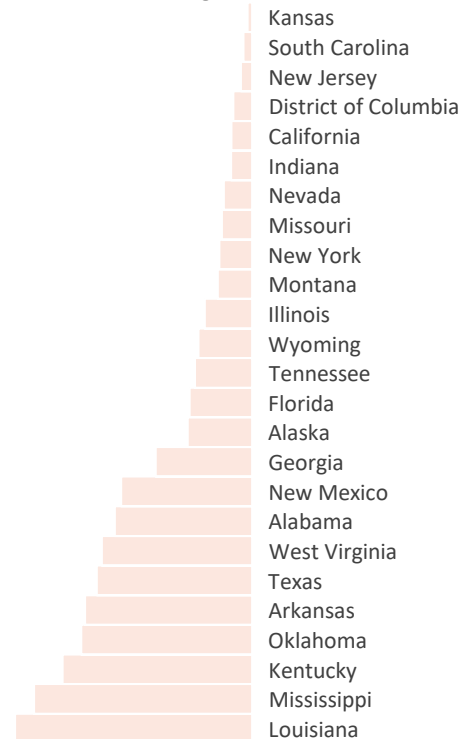
